Cello

The **cello** (/ˈtʃɛloʊ/ CHEL-oh), or **violoncello** - a bowed (sometimes plucked) string instrument of the violin family.

Four strings are tuned in perfect fifths: from low to high, C G D and A.

Beginners start by using the open strings.

Music for the cello is generally written in the bass clef.

Bass guitar

Music for the bass guitar is written in the bass clef.

Playing range



The strings of a bass guitar are tuned (low to high) in 4ths: E, A, D, G (like a double bass)

Keyboard


Keyboards can be used to play melody, harmony, chords, all sorts. Music is written for the two hands -

Right hand is in treble clef
