

## Instrument crib sheets (various Internet sources)

### Cello

The **cello** (/ˈtʃɛlɒʊ/ *CHEL-oh*), or **violoncello** - a **bowed** (sometimes **plucked**) **string instrument** of the **violin family**.

Four strings are **tuned** in **perfect fifths**: from low to high, **C G D and A**.

Beginners start by using the open strings.

Music for the cello is generally written in the **bass clef**.

### Bass guitar

Music for the bass guitar is written in the **bass clef**.

### Playing range



The strings of a bass guitar are tuned (low to high) in 4ths: E, A, D, G (like a double bass)

### Keyboard

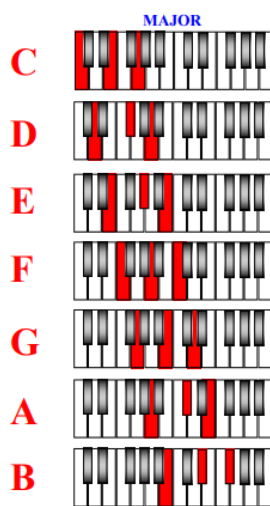
Keyboards can be used to play melody, harmony, chords, all sorts. Music is written for the two hands -

Left hand is in bass clef

Right hand is in treble clef

It's great for beginners to accompany a piece using a few simple notes or chords.

Here are some basic chords, start by just playing the first note of each, e.g. C, D, E, F, G, A or B
